Mortgage Pay-Off Appeal

On Sunday, May 19 the Saint Andrew Congregation voted in favor of using up to \$100,000 of the Contingency Fund to pay off the mortgage at the end of July. Through May 19, contributions toward the final payoff totaled \$23,924 of which \$20,000 is being matched. Additional contributions received will reduce the amount of Contingency funds needed for the final payment. Thank You to everyone who has helped to make this possible!

Opportunities to Volunteer at the Good Shepherd Shelter

1. Friday evenings: 6-7 Saint Andrew volunteers work with a paid staff person to check guests in, safely store their belongings for the night, hand out t-shirts and scrubs for them to sleep in, and serve supper. Each task is simple. You just need to be at least 18, and to treat the guests with kindness and dignity. Because you would be part of a team, you can choose how often your schedule allows you to par@cipate. To join the Saint Andrew team, see the sign-up sheet in the Narthex.

- **2. First, third and fifth Fridays:** meals that are simple, yet filling, are prepared for 30 guests by an individual or a team. If you have the skills and ①me to make a meal, but it is not in your budget, Social Ministry will provide financial support. If you're part of a meal-prep team, you could make a single hot dish instead of 3-4. The meal needs to be delivered to the shelter and ready to eat by 6:00 pm or make special arrangements.
- **3. Needed items** for the shelter are being collected throughout the month of May. Pull tags are available in the Narthex along with a collecion box.
