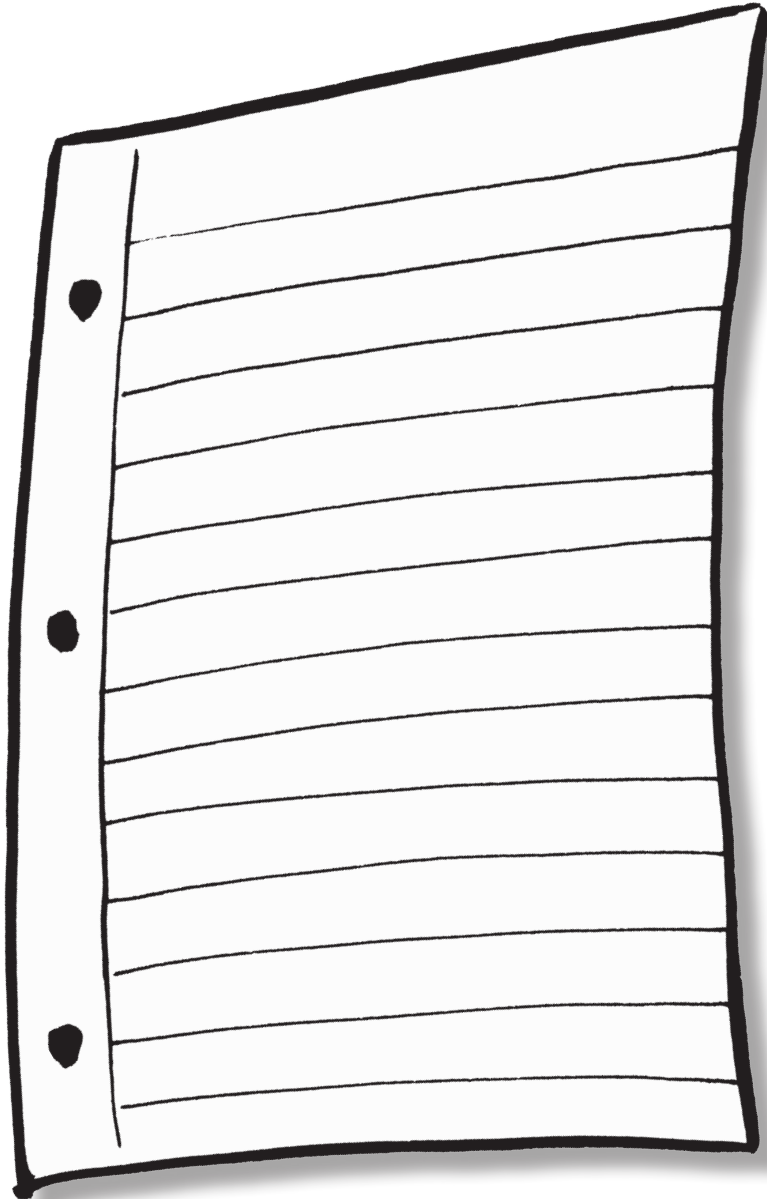
An Invitation To Join the 2027 Civil Rights Tour

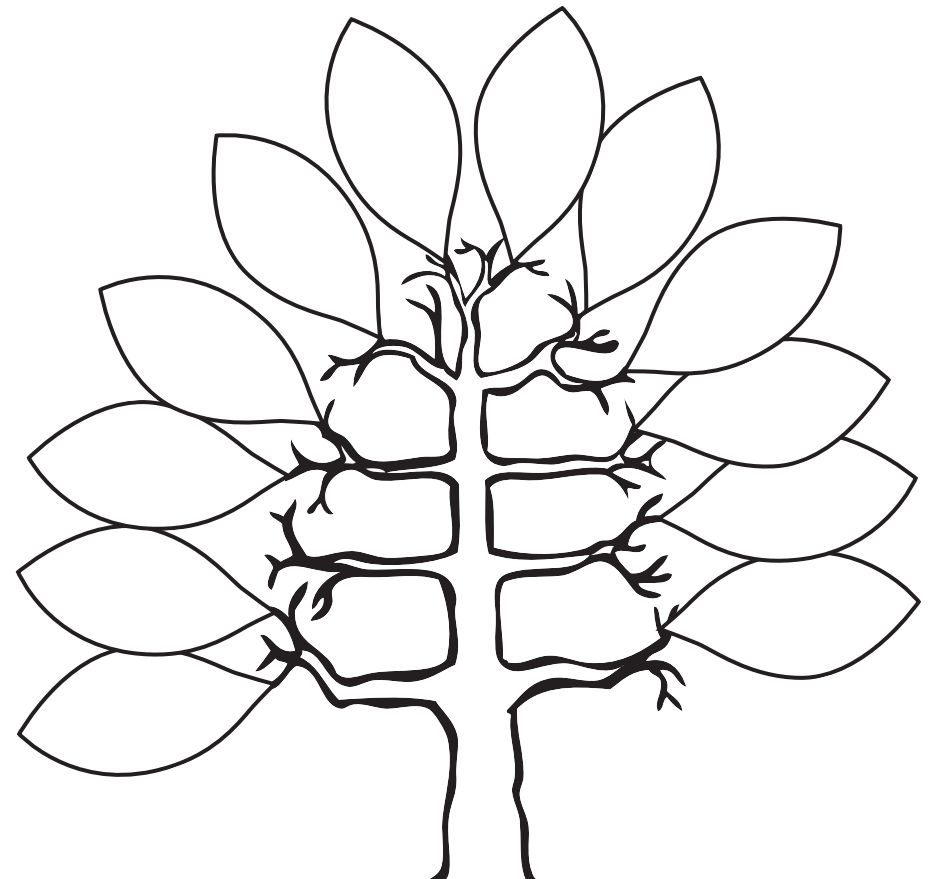

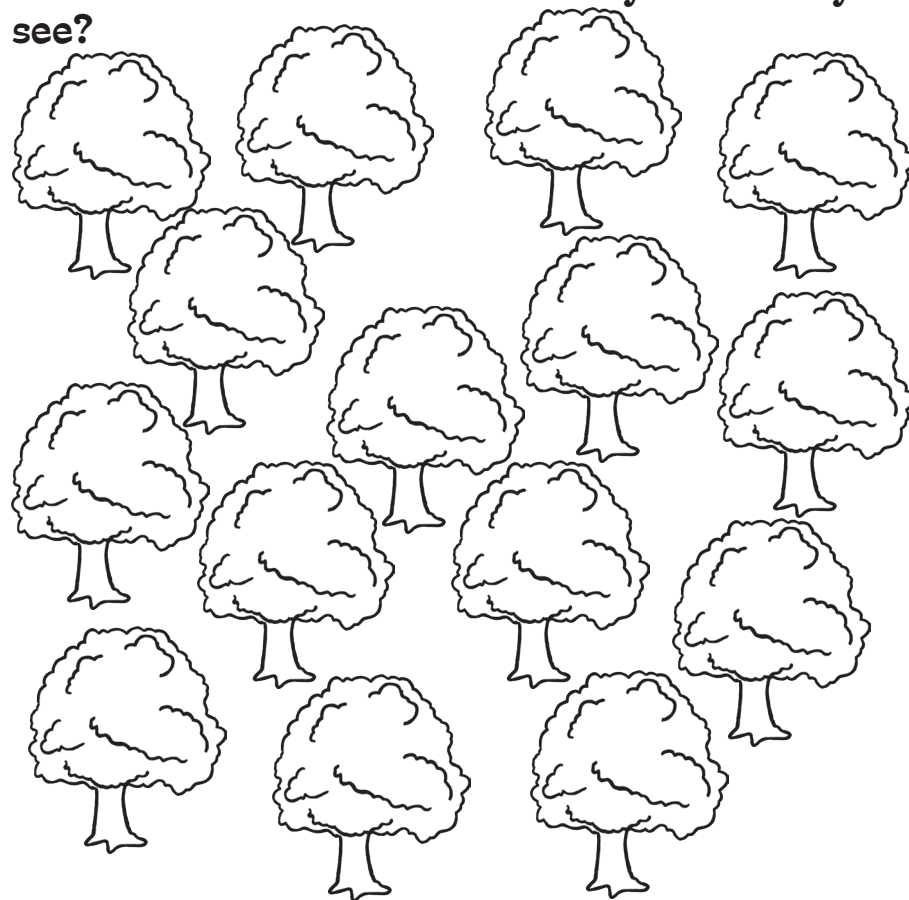
