Memory Verse

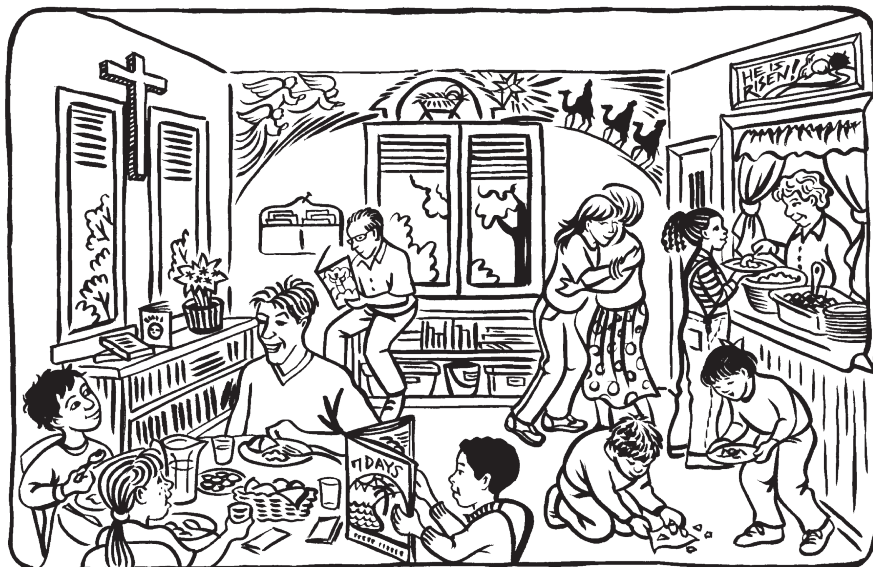


Jesus wants us to say yes with our words and our actions. Write the word YES under each word of the memory verse.
